Planner's Corner

4 Uses of Money: Live, Give, Owe, Grow.

A rite of Spring is filing income taxes (not both Alberta teams making the NHL playoffs ③). While filing, we can clearly see how we allocated the monetary resources God has given us. There are 4 basic areas:

Live – day-to-day expenses, the essentials such as food, clothing, shelter and discretionary items. A key Biblical principle is to spend less than you earn.

Give – In a recent webinar hosted by Kingdom Advisors*, Andy Stanley, pastor, communicator, author and founder of North Point Ministries, Atlanta, Georgia made several comments that prompted me to reflect on this area of my life.

"Uncertainty undermines generosity" – similar to investing, there always seems to be a reason not to give – job situation, economy, children's braces, etc.

"Generosity is the premeditated, calculated,





designated emancipation of personal financial assets". In simpler terms, generosity is the planned amount that is set free to others from your personal financial assets. Generosity is a wonderful antidote to an over-reliance on our material possessions. (and also contributes to overall mental health!)

Owe - Sometimes broken up into two categories, debt and taxes. A key Biblical principal is to work towards being debt free. Debt always mortgages the future. Being debt free allows you to focus on the other three uses of money...live, give, grow. As for taxes, if you pay taxes, rejoice, they are symptomatic of God's provision.

Grow - This is the only way to save for long term goals such as buying a home or achieving a 'comfortable' retirement.

An exercise to consider would be to take your income tax return, credit card, loans and mortgage statements and categorize each item in the 4 categories listed above. After reviewing, you can determine areas that need improvement. From there you can develop, implement, and monitor a plan in those areas. 

Bloom Where You are Planted



Jerome Cupido

In 2001, **Jerome Cupido** was asked to be part of feasibility study between Kenyan cattle farmers and CRWRC (now World Renew) and the Northern Alberta Diaconal Conference (NADC). This study's goal was to come alongside projects underway by providing additional resources such as equipment, training, or transportation.

While in Kenya, Jerome made a connection with Jeremiah, Project Manager of the Massia Rural Training Centre. Together, they identified a need to minimize the losses of moisture in feed so that when the droughts came, feed would still be available. Jerome made a commitment to come up with a solution. In January 2017, Jerome delivered a hand baler that he designed and manufactured that can be maintained by locally available parts and fuel. With a regular baler, there is complexity in tying and knotting the bale making it difficult to service and maintain in a third world country. The delivered baler is loaded by hand and bales are hand tied. The baler can be pushed, pulled, or dragged by people or donkeys and has a capacity to make 12 bales an hour. When using the hand baler during baling season, Jeremiah can make up to \$36 an hour - a substantial increase from his off season income of \$2 per day.



What's next for Jerome? Reducing the cost of the balers, and then assembling, and distributing them from Canada. He hopes to collaborate with a charitable organization that can identify and distribute to farmers who can make use of the baler. Lady Flower Gardens

Located adjacent to the North Saskatchewan River in Northeast Edmonton's Horse Hill Area, Lady Flower Gardens (LFG) has a 75-acre old growth forest, a large insulated yurt used for community events, and a 5-acre community garden. LFG is a Land Foundation with the objective of growing a healthy agricultural community with disadvantaged people. It differs from a standard foundation in that instead of providing grants and funds, it grants free access to agricultural products, land, and knowledge to community groups that work with disadvantaged Edmontonians. In 2016, 17 of these groups planted, weeded and harvested resulting in 52,000 lbs of produce going to Edmonton's Food Bank and over 20,000 lbs to themselves and their agencies.

Unfortunately, residential development is increasingly pressuring the agricultural and wildlands of Lady Flower Gardens and the 143 acres of prime agricultural lands south of it. In order to protect this land, landowner **Doug Visser**, and his partner **Kelly Mills**, hope to obtain a conservation easement with the Edmonton and Area Land Trust. This conservation easement will allow Lady Flower Gardens to become a catalyst for the development of a deeply rooted collaborative neighbourhood in which Edmontonians can learn to live sustainably with the land and each other.

Donations towards conserving the forest and particularly the agricultural lands will be held in an endowment fund at the Edmonton Community Foundation. Every donation made up to \$60,000 will be matched by Doug Visser. At the time of writing, with the matching funds, \$74,000 has been raised. To further fundraising, a benefit concert featuring Ann Vriend, Amy van Keeken and Joe Nolan is planned for Saturday, June 10. For more information, check out www.ladyflowergardens.com.
